

# PRAYING WITH JESUS

## SCRIPTURE ART JOURNAL

As you pray with Jesus, spend time in God's Word each day. As you hear the words of the Lord, let them challenge your heart to live them out. As you think about the words you read, either draw a picture or write a prayer. There is not a right or wrong way to do this journal. The important thing is that you spend time with Jesus. When we spend time with Him and seek Him with all our heart, He can mold us and shape us into the disciples He wants us to be. If you choose to draw a picture, you can add a blank piece of paper to this journal so you have more room to draw.

## WEEK 1: WHY PRAY THE LORD'S PRAYER?

### • SUNDAY

- Read: Isaiah 64:8
- Live It Out Challenge: God is the Potter, we are the clay. What is He teaching you? How is He molding and shaping you?

### • MONDAY

- Read: Matthew 7:24-28
- Live It Out Challenge: What is Jesus teaching you? How are you going to live it out in your everyday life?

### • TUESDAY

- Read: Matthew 4:18-22
- Live It Out Challenge: Immediately the disciples dropped their nets and followed Jesus. What does it mean to follow Jesus? What does that look like?

### • WEDNESDAY

- Read: Matthew 19:13-15
- Live It Out Challenge: Draw a picture of this scene. How did Jesus show love and care for children?

### • THURSDAY

- Read: John 15:1-17
- Live It Out Challenge: Several times Jesus says we are to remain. We are to stay connected to Him. What picture do you get in your head when you read these words of Jesus? How can you stay connected to Him?

### • FRIDAY

- Read: 1 Thessalonians 5:17
- Live It Out Challenge: We are to pray continually. That means communicating with God is something we do all the time, not just on Sundays. Take time to thank God and worship Him. Praying for anything specific? Draw it out as you talk with God.

### • SATURDAY

- Read: Mark 1:35-37
- Live It Out Challenge: Jesus valued spending time with His Father in prayer. How does taking time to pray to God help you grow stronger as a disciple?
